Celebrating 300 years of St George's Church

St George's Hanover Square Church is celebrating the **tercentenary** of its consecration on Sunday 23rd March 2025.

Carved out of the ancient parish of St-Martin-in-the-Fields, the historic boundaries of our parish originally included all of what is now Belgravia, Knightsbridge, Pimlico and Mayfair. The vestry of St George's was responsible for not only the church affairs but also for the civil government of this part of Westminster.

Today along with the Grosvenor Chapel the church serves modern-day Mayfair.

To celebrate this historic milestone, each pupil has been presented with a **keepsake bookmark**.
