Next week is Safer

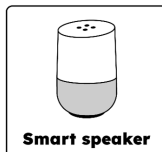
Internet Day and children

will be learning about keeping themselves safe online during the week. This is a topic we regularly teach children about in our **Keeping Safe** curriculum, Computing curriculum and assemblies.



We have looked at AI (Artificial Intelligence) and scams. We discussed with the KS2 children, how sometimes AI notifications and messages appear when online, for example, to say that you've won a prize and encouraging you to share personal details. This is not a good use of AI and it is important not to share personal information with these Chat Bots. Find out more then [Safer Internet Day 2025 - UK Safer Internet Centre](#)

Children cannot take full responsibility for online safety though - **parents must be responsible for safe behaviour online**, including when and how children have access. Even if your child already has a smartphone, you still have the power to change your mind and take it away. There are plenty of parents who don't give their child a smartphone. There's plenty of time when they're much older and more responsible to explore the online world!

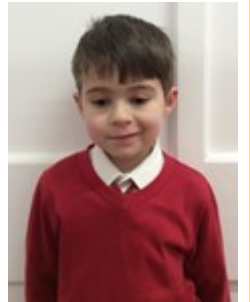

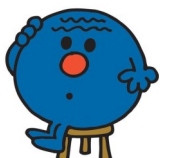
