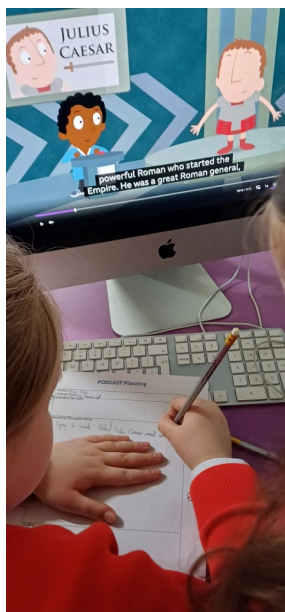
Dear Parents and Carers,

## Important dates for your diary.....



Week beginning Monday 16th March - last week of after-school enrichment clubs and last week of swimming for Year 3 and 4  
Thursday 26th March - Non-uniform day  
Friday 27th March at 3.30pm - last day of term

Monday 13th April - First day of the summer term

You will have seen news reports about meningitis cases. These are currently in the Kent region and not in London. We work closely with the Public Health team who have said that there is currently no action that schools in London are being asked to take.

Families should continue to come forward as standard for their normal routine vaccinations. Information on vaccinations can be found here [Meningitis - Vaccination - NHS](#).

Vaccinations offer some protection against certain causes of meningitis but not all.

It is therefore always recommended that everyone:

- Knows the signs and symptoms of Meningococcal disease and knows how to protect themselves and others.
- Check that they are up to date with all their routine vaccinations

Each child is allocated at **least one club**. Children on the waiting list the previous term who request the same club will be **prioritised for a place** in that club.
